


## **NELL Fall Meeting - 20th-21st September**

#### IHT awarded grant for Mark Island lighthouse repair

Island Heritage Trust has received a \$5,000 grant from the New England Lighthouse Lovers, a chapter of the American Lighthouse Foundation, according to a press release from the organization. Writing on behalf of NELL, Preservation Committee Chairman Frank Carbone noted that the "excellent supporting documentation," provided by IHT Executive Director Mike Little, was a significant factor in IHT's selection for the grant. For many years administered by the U.S. Lighthouse Service and later by the U.S. Coast Guard, Mark Island Light off Stonington came into IHT's possession in 1998. While the Coast Guard still maintains the automated foghorn and light in the tower, the building and the island are owned and maintained by IHT. Currently, the brick structure needs to be scraped, mortar joints repointed, and new "breathable" paint applied, at an estimated cost of \$26,880.

Prior to being awarded the NELL grant, the trust had \$8,000 saved for Mark Island Light maintenance. Board Chairman Ellen Rowan said, "We were thrilled to get the grant. We've been worried for some time about funding for Mark Island Light maintenance. The lighthouse is such a fixture of island life and has long been a beacon for both the working watermen and pleasure boaters. IHT is mindful of the history and significance of the lighthouse to the community, and, consequently, we don't take the responsibility of its care lightly. This grant will help move us considerably closer to our goal."

### Gay Head Light (Aquinnah) in the News

Singer **Rosanne Cash**, with husband **John Leventhal** joining her on guitar, performed at a fund-raiser benefiting Martha's Vineyard's beloved Gay Head Light. The sold-out event at Flatbread raised more than \$120,000 for the restoration and relocation of the landmark lighthouse. "Monk" actor (and Vineyard resident) **Tony Shalhoub** wielded the gavel at an auction that included a week in a Paris flat and a helicopter tour of the island followed by a catered dinner at the historic light. The Save the Gay Head Lighthouse Committee is now halfway to its goal of \$3 million, the cost to move the lighthouse away from the edge of the eroding Gay Head cliffs. (The light now stands barely 45 feet from the edge of the cliff.)

### Grant for Point No Point Lighthouse Windows

HANSVILLE — Point No Point Lighthouse will receive \$4,760 for restoration of eight windows.

The money comes from Lighthouse Environmental Programs, a Whidbey Island-based non-profit organization. Funds for the grants come from the sale of Washington lighthouse license plates.

Other lighthouse receiving grants included Browns Point in Tacoma, Burrows Island in Anacortes, New Dungeness in Sequim, North Head in Long Beach, and Turn Point in the San Juan Islands.

## International Lighthouse News



### Environment: Mediterranean lighthouse network project starts

ANSAméd) - CAGLIARI - The Mediterranean Lighthouse Project MEDPHARES has been launched in Cagliari, in Sardinia. The project involves France, Tunisia and Lebanon, and three semaphoric stations controlled in Sardinia: Cagliari, Sant'Antioco and Asinara.

The objective is to create an international network to develop strategies to conserve, restore and improve lighthouses and semaphore stations. And also to make this heritage a worldwide attraction. "A wonderful opportunity for Sardinia, it will give protection and give back to the local communities a large local coastal heritage, once a precious support to navigators and fundamental defensive garrison, tomorrow a factor of development for the area", said Alessio Satta, director of the Conservatory of the coasts of Sardinia, the project leader, at the end of the technical survey of southern Sardinia's lighthouses, in the presence of the Conservatoire du Littoral et des Rivages Lacustres, representing the French government.

The first concrete step of the project was the work of the first Steering Committee, which is the meeting of the partners that set up the operational methodology for the production of the network.

Integrated Program of Improvement is therefore taking shape, which follows the approval of the regional council that entrusts to Conservatory of the Coasts fifteen coastal conservation areas owned by region. The project can count on European funding of one million, 770 thousand euro. There are nine identified "pilot" sites to carry on restoration and improvement actions through discussion between citizens and institutions.

In Sardinia, involved are the Sant'Elia in Cagliari lighthouse and signal station, and the light houses and semaphoric stations on the islands of Sant'Antioco and Asinara.
