













SPECIAL MONTH FOR NELL

25 YEARS OLD

The organizational meeting for what became NELL met at the Grill 93 Restaurant in Andover, Massachusetts on November 8,1998 with 34 people in attendance. This meeting took place after a sign-up sheet was placed at a Harbour Lights Reunion event by Barbara Hupp in October of 1998 in Providence, RI, asking for interest in forming a "Harbour Lights Collectors Club of New England" group. Since Harbour Lights was a copyrighted name, the group guickly changed its name to **New England Lighthouse Lovers (NELL)** which it has remained through the last 25 years. At the organizational meeting, Barbara Hupp was chosen as the first President. The next meeting that took place was what became an annual Spring NELL lighthouse trip/meeting. This gathering took place on April 24, 1999 in Groton, CT at the University of Connecticut which is where Avery Point Lighthouse is located. The first guest speaker was Elinor DeWire who had a 35mm slide show and talk about lighthouses. The next day a visit and tour was made to New London Ledge Lighthouse. Below are a few photos of the first Annual Spring trip/meeting:

The next meeting/event was planned for October 9, 1999 (a 1st Anniversary meeting) and became an annual NELL Fall Trip. It took place in Portsmouth, New Hampshire where a talk was given by past lighthouse keeper's wife and author, Connie Small who was 98 years young. A couple of years later,





in 2001, the first annual Lighthouses, Hot Chocolate and You took place in January around Scituate Light in Massachusetts, where it was climbed (see below) and other nautical places in the area were visited. This three events a year schedule has continued thru this year, except for a few of the events that were cancelled from Spring of 2020 until Fall of 2021 due to Covid19.





There was a special NELL10th Anniversary Picnic held on September 19, 2009 in New Haven, Ct with two Anniversary cakes served. Participants were also able to climb the Five Mile Point Lighthouse that was on the grounds of the park where the picnic was held. (see photos below)







Since the first trip back in 1999, NELL has seen, and/or climbed all but a handful of lighthouses in the New England states. There have been 11 trips to Maine, 3 to New Hampshire, 3 to Vermont, 24 to Massachusetts, 7 to Rhode Island, and 12 to Connecticut. We've also gone to New York for 6-7 trips and New Jersey for 3.

Membership in NELL has fluctuated quite a bit through the years. In the very beginning there were 34 members and at its highest there were as many as 350 members. The number of members also affected the number who attended trips and donated toward the preservation fund. Currently our membership is approximately 150 people. Although 19 states are represented in the membership, the overwhelming majority are from the New England States. There are also still approximately 20 Charter Members still involved with NELL.

A Button/Pin for the first trip to New London Ledge light was presented to participants by Ron Foster. They began to be made regularly by Ron, for all the trips, in the Fall of 2001. In the Fall of 2007 Bob Taylor took that job over. At some point Ron also started adding a lighthouse postcard to the packet of information attendees of the trips would get. This job was also taken over by Bob Taylor around 2010. (You can see photos of all the Buttons/Pins created in the 4 pages after this article – the first two pages are from the 2011 NELL Beacon and the rest I was able to attach from the NELL History books,) Sorry I was unable to add the date and location of each trip below the photo of the button, but they are in order of when the trips took place.

Another event that started to be held in January of 2014 is what has become the annual cookie contest at our Lighthouses, Hot Chocolate & You trip (LHHC&Y). Any member who wanted to be included could bake enough cookies for all members attending the trip and the top three "favorites" were chosen by votes from the attending members.

At this Fall's NELL meeting, the 10th President of our group, Arlene Winkleman was voted for. The Presidents through the years have been: Barbara Hupp 1998–2000, Ron Foster 2000-2004, Sherin Pagles 2004-2006, Tom Pregman 2006-2007, Tom Kenworthy 2007-2012, Bill Kent, 2012-2016, Greg Fitzgerald 2017, Ron Foster 2018, and Henry Winkleman 2019-2023

Another activity of NELL which started in 1999 was the crowning of a Ms. NELL for the coming year. Our first Ms. NELL was Penny Patch. Not to be outdone, the men started to choose a Mr. Nell in the fall of 2000, when Ron Drummer was chosen to fill the role. In the beginning a crown was given to the Nell lady who was chosen as Ms. NELL. The Mr. NELL was given a blue boat paddle with a painted lighthouse on one side and the names on the other. In 2012 when Lynn Kerber was Ms. Nell, she made a quilted cloth banner which had a lighthouse on one side and the names of all the previous Ms. Nells on the back with room to add the new names each year. In 2019 new "trophies" were made for Mr. &

Ms. Nell. Mr. NELL was given a yellow buoy with the NELL logo on one side and name on back and the Ms. NELL was given a wooden lighthouse shaped plaque containing the NELL logo and names on the front in addition to the crown which has continued to be passed on since the beginning. (see Although the idea of Mr. & Ms. Nell is for the previously chosen recipient to choose someone who they feel served Nell in some way and worked toward its goals, the following paragraph comes from the pages of the History Books when in 2005 Bob Taylor choose Norm Bosse as the new Bob Taylor wrote in part: "This year's winner follows a long tradition of service to NELL and its goals. After the very successful MISS NELL event, the men decided they did not want to be left out based on gender eligibility. Early on, Mr. Frank Carbone Jr. was asked to list the qualifications for this honor and true to Frank's sense of humor, he listed the following qualifications for Mr NELL. (1) Tends to stand still in the middle of traffic; (2) Has to be "broad in the beam", (3) Likes to get a "glow" on or, Likes to get "oiled" up; (4) Narrowest in the upper structure (and function); and (5) Very limited response capability. It is a wonder that anyone covets this annual award with criteria like that! People have asked me what are the major responsibilities of MR. NELL? There are actually two. First, before the year is out, one has to find an artist who can paint your name on the oar in such a way that you do not stand out, but rather look like one of the boys. Secondly and without being able to form a committee and blame others, you must decide who the next Mr. NELL is. The rest of the year Mr.

NELL can just enjoy the activities and be 'one of the boys'."













One of the more important sides of NELL is its goal to contribute to the preservation of our lighthouses. Since the very first meeting in the spring of 1999, NELL has been donating to the preservation of the lighthouses we are able to see/climb and also have donated much to lighthouses who ask for funds for specific preservation projects. To this date NELL has donated a little over \$189,000.00 to lighthouse preservation. A complete listing of all the donations made is included in the History Books along with photos of plagues and letters from recipients of donations, etc.

Another part of NELL has been the H.O.P.E. projects where members of NELL actually do hands on preservation work at a specific lighthouse for a period of days.

The complete history of NELL is kept up to date by Bob Taylor in what has frequently been mentioned They contain documents of all kinds, photos of the trips, buttons, above as the History Books. postcards, special events. All this information is kept organized in three large 3-ring binders. I encourage any member who attends the trips to find a little extra time to look through these books. They are regularly brought to the events and I'm sure could even be "borrowed" during the event.


